

COMPARING HOME OWNERS ASSOCIATIONS (HOAS) AND NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS: DISTINCTIONS, CITY REOURCES, AND LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

> <u>Description</u>: Complete Streets is an approach to planning, designing, building, operating, and maintaining streets that enables safe access for all people who need to use them, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and abilities. Attendees will learn the Complete Streets approach, gain strategies to evaluate street design and implement traffic calming, identify workshop opportunities to improve streets in their own neighborhood.

COLLABORATION BREAKOUT SESSION: CULTURAL COMPETENCY FRAMEWORK AND ENGAGING DIVERSE NEIGHBORS
